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| <p>English Year 3 will be creating work inspired by our topic of Africa. Year 3 will be working on the books 'Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain' by Verna Aardema and 'The Butterfly Lion' by Michael Morpurgo. We will be reading and discussing the book, looking at unfamiliar vocabulary, understanding characters and settings, finding information in the text, writing stories based on the text, newspaper reports and drama.</p> | | <p>Maths The children will follow the Mathematics programme of study from the National Curriculum and the Mathematics White Rose mastery scheme. Year 3 will cover fractions, time, properties of shape, mass and capacity.</p> |
| <p>Topic This term our Geography topic is Africa, including Art, Design Technology and ICT curriculum areas. The children will be learning about where Africa is in the world, key facts about the African landscape and different countries that make up Africa, famous Africans including Nelson Mandela, animals, art, music, sport, comparing Goring with Africa including looking at African schools and African myths.</p> | | <p>R.E. This term will follow the Christianity Project Big Questions: 'When Jesus left what was the impact of Pentecost?' focusing on the events that happened after the crucifixion, the story of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit and the Trinity and symbols of Pentecost. 'What do Christians learn from the Creation story?', focusing on the Jewish/Christian creation story, the Fall. How to look after God's creation, being tempted, saying sorry and taking responsibility.</p> |
| <p>Science Term 3 Our Science topics this term are all about plants; identifying the different features that make up a plant and recognising what plants need to grow healthily.</p> | | <p>Computing We will be continuing our programming by learning about loops and nested loops. We will be practicing their internet searching and keyboard skills and how to create and send emails. Then we will be learning about networks and how the internet works.</p> |
| <p>Art We will be using Art alongside our Geography topic. We will be making African masks out of clay, prints of African scenes, Maasai beadwork collars, Kikuyu shields, Ndebele house paintings, body paintings, animal banners and black and white decorative maps. We will be working individually and in groups.</p> | | <p>Design and Technology Year 3 Summer topic will be 'Moving Monsters' We will be designing and making monster models using simple pneumatics to create moving parts.</p> |
| <p>Music Music lessons will be following Music Express and the Charanga programme for Year 3. During the year, the children will have the opportunity to perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions. They will also explore using different percussion instruments, composing their own songs and rhythms and learning songs with different themes.</p> | | <p>PE Children will continue to learn about warming up safely and recognise changes in the body during exercise. We will be working on team work and playing small sided games in athletics and striking and fielding games as well as swimming. PE kits should be in school for Mondays and Thursdays.</p> |
| <p>French We will revise the vocabulary we have learnt in the Autumn and Spring term, as well as learning some more songs in French, how to ask questions, using verbs in the 1st and 2nd person, practising numbers 7-10, asking for something politely using please/thank you.</p> | | <p>PSHE We will use the Scarf scheme of work to discuss 'Being My Best' (healthy eating, health and hygiene, empathy, identifying talents and achievements, working together) and 'Growing and Changing' (identifying different types of relationship, what a healthy relationship looks like, personal space, safe and unsafe secrets, who to ask for help, changes in our bodies, basic first aid)</p> |
